As a teenager, Michael was intrigued by the street life. He dropped out of 9th grade and ended up in prison for the first time at age 16, accumulating 13 total years behind bars over the next two decades.

Michael realized he wanted more for his children, and he knew education was the avenue. He was willing to do whatever it took to make sure their futures played out differently than his.

Today, Michael's three daughters are thriving at an ACE partner school, which he refers to as a "refuge" for his family. The safe, academically-challenging, and character-forming learning environment is setting his daughters on a path to success. Impressively, Michael himself is now going back to school. We're humbled and proud to partner with hardworking families like Michael's, who make incredible sacrifices to ensure their children have a chance at success.

Your support ignites a powerful generational impact that ripples in both directions, positively affecting both children and parents. In fact, Michael is not alone; many ACE parents choose to pursue post-secondary credits after their children receive scholarships.



Together, we are igniting a powerful ripple effect that will impact generations to come.

Here are some 2018 highlights:

ARKANSAS

- Launched for the 2018-19 school year with 32 private school partnerships and 299 scholarships
- Families expressed gratitude for being able to send children to schools in which they are taught effectively and cared for, where they are safe and secure, and where they are experiencing exponential growth

COLORADO

- Kicked off 2020 Campaign to increase scholars served by 50% (2,000 to 3,000) over three years and received 61 multi-year commitments to enable us to sustainably execute this increase—halfway to our funding goal
- Celebrated a 98% high school graduation rate for the Class of 2018

KANSAS

- Raised over \$1 million for the Tax Credit Scholarship Program
- Increased number of ACE scholarships from 319 to 398 at 55 partner schools
- Received a \$500,000 matching gift opportunity for 2019-20 school year

LOUISIANA

- Raised enough funds to add 500 scholarships this coming fall, to serve 1,750 total students at our 186 partner schools in the 2019-20 school year
- Successfully implemented Louisiana's new tax credit scholarship program (Tuition Donation Credit) in 2018

MISSOURI

- Launched for the 2018-19 school year with 16 private school partnerships and over 120 scholarships
- Expanding to other parts of Missouri beyond Kansas City in the 2019-20 school year

MONTANA

- Celebrated second year in a row of a 100% high school graduation rate
- Surpassed 5,000th scholarship awarded since Montana program's inception in 2012

TEXAS


- Currently supporting 363 students and partnered with 63 schools in Dallas/Fort Worth
- More than doubled our scholarship recipients in Houston year over year, for a total of 813 students and 71 partner schools in the 2018-19 school year
- Launched San Antonio for the 2018-19 school year, serving 44 students at 6 partner schools

WYOMING

- 40 additional scholarships and 3 new partner schools for the 2018-19 school year
- Surpassed 400th scholarship awarded since Wyoming program's inception in 2017
